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Executive Summary

IFIP TC2 Meeting, July 9, 2024, Zoom

IFIP TC2 officers, elected unanimously in 2023 by TC2 and then appointed by the IFIP president.

1. Registration and agenda

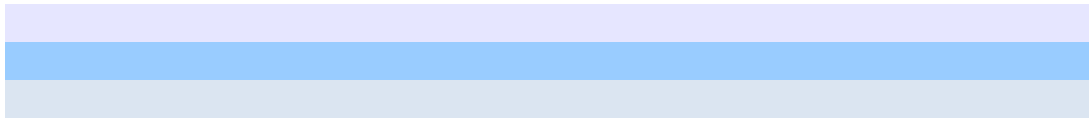
The meeting took place virtually, via Zoom, hosted by Jacques Carette at McMaster University.

3. Action items from the previous meeting

1. Michael Goedicke has contacted some people who are interested in redeveloping a 2.10, but the discussions are not complete. He hope to conclude within the coming year.
2. Michael Goedicke is still working on research data management and welcomes outside participation.
3. Jacques reports that there is not currently funding available at the IFIP level for travel grants. Apparently IFIP is not doing well financially. There is an interest among the TC2 membership for this issue, ie to improve diversity. Michael Goedicke suggested that the issue could be brought up at the general assembly.
4. Some discussion about in-person meetings. Some people would have to travel quite far. Previously meetings were a full day and included a keynote, opportunities to meet new people, etc.
5. Numerous WG officers needed to be replaced. This has all been done.

4. IFIP update

IFIP's budget is currently negative. Need to generate more funds. TC2 does not generate much money, but does not cost much money either.

4.1 Emeritus status

As a reminder, at the IFIP level, emeritus members are not listed as members. On the other hand, if the working group has a member list on their web page, they should list their emeritus members and designate them as such.

5. Budget for 2022 and 2023

Funds available at the end of each year:

Budget details are found in the attached slides from Ina.

In 2023, we had no royalties and no event proceeds, of which we receive 75%, ie 0 euros. This led to a total income for 2023 of 0 euros.

In 2023, we had no expenses. Our current balance is 11,949.54 euros.

For 2023, we proposed the following budget:

- 300 Euros - Income Royalties (Item 3)
- 300 Euros - Income Event Proceeds (Item 4a)
- 2000 Euros – Expenses (Item 9a): 1024 Euros Manfred-Paul-Award, plus potential meeting organization

For 2024 we propose the same. The budget proposal was unanimously accepted.

Events:

6. Awards and distinctions

Manfred Paul award:

Manfred Paul award had only one candidate this year, but a good one. Jacques encourages more nominations, which is not that much work. At least one author has to be a member of a working group.

The Award process Timeline (as agreed in 2021) is as follows:
Award Selection Committee Solicitation email – 01 September
Award Selection Committee Volunteer deadline – 01 October
Award Submission Deadline 15 October
Award Announcement 10 December
We will propose the MP award winner for IFIP Select.

We encourage WGs to consider nominating work that is presented at the WG and generates a lot of discussion. The work should be published in 2023 or 2024.

IFIP awards:

Nominations open for Silver Core award and Service award possible until July 15. WGs can nominate. The TC2 chair has to approve nominations.
IFIP Fellow Nominations for 2024 already closed.

Rustan Leino notes that it is hard to find the Fellow nomination page. Also when people get the award, they need a webpage that shows what the award is about. There is also a concern that the timeline is not clear.

There were no TC2 IFIP awards in 2023 and we have made no nominations in 2024.

There will likely be a new call from IFIP for people to be on the fellows committee, as current terms are expiring.

8. Reports of WG chairs

See attached reports.

2.1: Tried a hybrid approach, eg to help emeritus members. Only a couple people have participated remotely. Both new members approved (Pierre-Evariste Dagand and Niki Vazou).

2.2: Delia Kesner approved as a new member.

2.3: Two live meetings in the past year, no new members.

2.4: Two meetings in the last year, doing 2 live and one virtual. Took in 6 more people, to compensate for upcoming retirements. Maybe they should revisit the group description. All 6 new members approved (Jan Vitek, Alessandra Gorla, Cristian Cadar, Lin Tan, Jonathan Bell, and Yingfei Xiong).

2.5: New chair and vice chair, still looking for a secretary.
Two meetings, both hybrid, both having more online participants.
Good to have new people for officers, need to have new members.

2.6: 4 small meetings in the year

Question of why so few members for such a big research area. They are working on integrating more people.

2.7: Usually meet adjacent to the interact conference. Organized a workshop on teaching HCI in York. Have considered on whether their focus needs an update; will be considering the impact of AI.

Have organized 4 "live talks" on topics requested by the members. These are done online and are preserved on youtube.

New member Jan Van den Bergh approved.

2.8: No officer present. Niki Vazou approved a a new member.

2.9: Dalal Alrajeh approved as a new member.

2.11: Friedrich Steimann approved as a new member

2.13: Two virtual meetings, doubts about the future of their conference, and thus of the group. Jacques will discuss with them.

2.14: Also thinking about how to continue in the future. their community was very Europe based, but this community has somehow disappeared. used to meet with service oriented and cloud computing, but this conference is attracting fewer people.

The group is working on streamlining the membership and looking for new members. They are working on putting together a Dagstuhl meeting to bring together the people in the field.

2.15: No representative present from the group. The group has not met recently.

2.16: the three retiring members will be emeritus members. All new members approved: Christos Dimoulas, Cyrus Omar, Tomas Petricek, Joe Politz, Ben Titzer, Tobias Wrigstad. They wonder if there is an upper limit in the number of members?

Response:

1. There is no maximum number of members for a group
2. There is no minimum either, but 5 active members is informally considered minimum viable. At that size, the 5 should be actively recruiting.

2.17: No one present.

8. WG proposal on AI

Should a group on generative AI be cross-listed with TC2?

Concern that the scope is too large to make sense. Proposition goes into depth in a wide range of areas. Could there be a TC2 specific AI group? Could such a group be temporary, as the field will evolve a lot?

What is the question for us? Does TC2 want to be involved in some way?

There are lots of interactions between generative AI and software, especially the practice of software.

Question about who would be a member of such a group, and how many such people will attend more than once, due to the wide scope.

Encouragement to keep relevant TC chairs in the loop.

9. Future meetings and events

The next meeting is likely to be at the same time of year, due to information having arrived from IFIP and gives time to prepare for the GA meeting in September. There was support for continuing with online meetings for TC2.

10. Other issues

ESOCC and FSEN are expected to run in 2025

Rules around sponsorship are likely going to change, in a way that is not so favorable for small meetings.

Michael Goedicke and Jacques met with Springer about the AICT series. One could publish a book giving an overview of the topic of the group in this series.

Could be a venue for folklore knowledge.

12. Action items

12.1 Working group officers

According to IFIP Bylaws, Section 4.37:

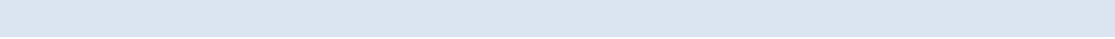
The term of office of Working Group Chairmen and Vice-Chairmen shall be three years and may be renewed once only.
